



Relocating to 55 Water Street



'm very proud to announce that MJHS Health System has reached a new milestone. We are relocating our corporate headquarters to 55 Water Street in the financial district of downtown Manhattan. We are scheduled to start occupying our new space in July of 2023, when our lease in Brooklyn expires. A critical part of our roots, MJHS will continue to maintain a presence in Brooklyn. We will also keep our Garden City office.

Improving quality of life for our employees was at the top of the list during our office search. 55 Water is a sun-filled, high-security building with advanced technology that will offer our employees access to important amenities within the building complex and in the surrounding community. The new space will also give our staff much greater access to public transportation, including proximity to multiple subways, bus lines and ferries.

The current office space in Brooklyn is spread across numerous buildings, plus we have offices at 39 Broadway in Manhattan. Our new 138,000-square-foot space on the 46th and 47th floors at 55 Water will bring together most of our office-based staff, supporting even greater collaboration between business lines and across the organization. The consolidation of offices and larger floor sizes at 55 Water will facilitate greater efficiency and allow us to reduce our square footage needs by 20 percent. Continuing our office search and negotiating the lease during the pandemic allowed us to obtain favorable terms. This has enabled us to provide a much-improved environment for our staff while remaining fiscally responsible.

Here's to the exciting next chapter in the story of MJHS!

Dollars raised provide additional Home Health Aide (HHA) support—over and above what patients are eligible to receive—to help caregivers who are in desperate need of additional support but don't have the resources to pay for it.

Thanks to the generosity of attendees, we were able to provide an additional 827 HHA hours to support caregivers in crisis, bringing our total

> hours funded for 2022 to over 1,900!

To help ground us in the importance of this fund, Peter, whose father was receiving care from MJHS Hospice, shared with the crowd how his family benefited from the additional hours.

Donations raised through our annual Wine Tasting helped provide additional **HHA** hours to support Peter and his family.





WCBS—Eye on Hospice Care: MJHS Expertise on Display

o help more New Yorkers learn about hospice care, **MJHS teamed up with CBS New York** for a four-part educational series that aired on television and is available online.

The first segment features **Susan Lage**, a senior vice president with MJHS Hospice. She begins by explaining that "saying yes" to hospice care means saying yes to receiving quality end-of-life medical care with compassion, dignity and respect. She adds that it also means the patient and family are offered emotional, spiritual and psychological support. Up next is **Toby Weiss**, assistant vice president of our Hospice Cultrual Diversity Program. She focuses on our person-centered care and adds that each patient's current needs and sensitivities are rooted in everything from past experiences, family dynamics, and religious beliefs to identity. Our deep understanding of different cultures allows MJHS Hospice clinicians to tailor a plan of care for patients and families.



Our very own **Dr. Damani Taylor**, senior pediatric hospice physician, is in the third CBS Eye on Hospice Care segment. He talks about our specialized pediatric hospice program and explains that overwhelmed and frightened parents often

don't realize that their child can continue to pursue curative treatments while receiving hospice care from our organization. **Marguerite Metzendorf**, director of integrative medicine and bereavement services, closes out the series by highlighting the important roles of our art and music therapists, chaplains, volunteers and bereavement counsellors.

Love, Music, Art and Memories


Our innovative memory care programs at Isabella and Menorah Centers for Rehabilitation and Nursing Care offer a range of non-pharmacological interventions, programs and services, including art, music, and horticulture therapies. From Symphony Magazine and The Staten Island Advance to News12 Brooklyn and i Advance Senior Care, our incredible Menorah Center staff and the residents who live on the 80-bed memory care wing, continue to capture the attention of reporters!

Still Hearing Wedding Bells

Before the music began and the flower girl walked down the aisle, Mikhail was already grinning from ear to ear. The big day at Menorah Center had finally arrived. After 65 years of marriage, the 89-year-old resident was renewing wedding vows with his

beloved Feyga, who also lives at Menorah. **News12 Brooklyn** was there to record it all—from the live music and exchange of vows to the big cheers and toasts at the end. Word spread fast. Mikhail and Feyga's love story reached audiences as far away as Israel. Special thanks to Menorah staff, particularly the memory care team, for planning the heartwarming summer celebration. During the reception, some residents spoke of their great loves, others remembered their own weddings, and

many participated in a singalong of tunes that were popular in the 1950s and 60s.





Best Practices for Supporting Emotional Wellness Among Residents

In Symphony Magazine and i Advance Senior Care, Kendra Ray, PhD, the dementia program's director who is a leading researcher and soughtafter expert in music therapy, outlines some of the ways she and her team monitor and address the emotional wellness of Menorah Center residents with memory loss. In the magazine, Dr. Ray describes "music as medicine for our souls" because it "decreases agitation, reduces depression, improves motor skills, and increases mental acuity." In the online publication, she highlights that Menorah Center offers virtual music therapy so families can participate. "We take the same approach with art therapy, sending art supplies to family members so they are able to virtually participate in the sessions....These virtual groups give residents that valuable opportunity to engage with family members, even at a distance."

Inspiration Is Everywhere, in Everything

The Staten Island
Advance profiled the memory care program at Menorah Center through exploring the inspiring life and career of dementia program coordinator Olga Barbakova. On the front page, Olga shares that her art therapy projects for



residents begin with everyday ideas, like the bright sun on a summer day. She adds that the residents use everyday materials, from tins to envelopes, to create memorable pieces. Art, Olga says, has been a vehicle of change and positivity for those she has worked with by creating friendships, connecting residents with their pasts, and staying engaged while relieving stress.

at MJHS Menorah Center



As the natural progression of life takes its course, some inividuals can become more and more socially isolated. This often happens as people get older and weaker, are no longer connected to their family, leave the workplace, their spouses and friends slowly pass away, or develop a disability or illness.

to loneliness, depression and

other health risks.

Social isolation is a lack of social connections and leads to loneliness, depression, and other health risks. It is a growing public health concern in

our aging society, especially in nursing homes. And the impact of COVID-19 exacerbated this tremendously across the country. Residents have experienced depressed moods and post-traumatic stress syndrome due to the inability

to connect with family and friends as frequently.

With the help of two generous grants from the Sephardic Foundation for the Aged, we are helping combat social isolation in our residents at our Menorah Center. The funding has helped us establish an interdisciplinary team that offers psychosocial services, music and creative arts therapy.

It has also allowed us to partner with our

neighbors at Kingsborough Community College to develop intergenerational programming and mindfulness practices.

The work began with our long-term residents, and we are expanding the services to short-term rehab patients

as well as working with those transitioning to long-term care. With the help of The Sephardic Foundation, this program continues to grow and has become an integral part of the critical care at Menorah Center.

Whether they do not have insurance or need assistance with copays, MJHS believes that all New Yorkers deserve to spend their final months and days being cared for with dignity and respect.

In 2022, raising support for the Charitable Care Fund was a priority for MJHS Foundation. In fact, we made it the focus of our Employee Giving Campaign. We're pleased to share that our own employees came together and raised over \$100,000 toward this important effort!

This community-wide effort allowed MJHS to offer 26 patients and families the full range of hospice services and care we provide... and that they would otherwise have been unable to afford.

One of those patients was Maria*, who was in New York City from Panama visiting her daughter when she had a stroke. This life-threatening episode rendered Maria unable to travel back to her home country. What made her situation even more heartbreaking was that, without insurance, she would have had to spend her final days in the hospital. However, thanks to the MJHS Charitable Care Fund, Maria was able to be transferred to her daughter's home, where she received hospice care and support until she passed away peacefully surrounded by family.


